The Origins Of The Commonwealth

WHAT IS THE COMMONWEALTH?

The Commonwealth is a voluntary association between 72 nations and territories, most of which are former British Colonies. The Commonwealth began during the gradual dissolution of the British Empire.

At the 1926 Imperial Conference it was agreed that all countries were equal members of a community within the British Empire and they all owed allegiance to the British King or Queen, however the United Kingdom would not rule over them.

WHO CAN JOIN THE COMMONWEALTH?

As of now, any country can apply to join the Commonwealth, with membership being based on free and equal voluntary co-operation. The last four countries to join the Commonwealth have no historical ties to the British Empire. These countries were Rwanda, Mozambique, Gabon and Togo.

HOW MANY PEOPLE MAKE UP THE COMMONWEALTH?



Members of the Commonwealth account for nearly one third of the world's population – around 2.5 billion. It is believed that 60% of the people in the Commonwealth are under the age of 30.

WHO LEADS THE COMMONWEALTH?



Following the death of Queen Elizabeth II last year, Commonwealth member countries chose to make King Charles III, Head of the Commonwealth.

COMMONWEALTH RECORDS









Over the years, the Commonwealth Games has been the backdrop for some of sports greatest moments, including Team England's Nicola Adams becoming the first ever woman to win a Commonwealth Games boxing gold medal in 2014.

The seventh edition of the Commonwealth Youth Games will take place in Trinidad and Tobago in August 2023. This will see athletes aged 14–18 battle it out across seven different sports and provide a platform for those athletes to go on to senior championships. For example, the Bello brothers, who won gold at the 2017 Commonwealth Youth Games in the Bahamas, went on to claim the bronze medal in Beach Volleyball at B2022.

Sport is just the beginning

The CGF also aim to inspire Commonwealth athletes to drive the impact and ambition of all Commonwealth Citizens through Sport. The Commonwealth Sport movement focuses around three core values - Humanity, Equality and Destiny.

The next edition of the Commonwealth Games will take place in Victoria, Austrlia in 2026. This will be the first time that the Games take place across a whole region, bringing economic benefit to more than a single city.





PROCESS GOALS:




Process goals are specific actions or 'processes' of performing and can often be 100% controlled by the individual.
